## **Detailed Work Experience**

### **December 2008 to Present**

**Mr. Fichtelman has resumed the duties he performed from June 1987 to March 2005.**

### **March 2005 to December 2008**

**Commercial Manager- Mr. Fichtelman was employed by the Owner/Developer. He reported directly to the Executive Vice President of Construction and was responsible for the Contractual, Legal, and Administrative (including OCIP) functions of project management for a \$600 million Public/Private Design Build Infrastructure Project, including coordination with Federal, State and Local Agencies.**

### **June 1987 – March 2005**

**Mr. Fichtelman was proprietor of his own firm specializing in public works contracting. This included field experience in contract administration and management, contract financial management and accounting.
