Experience for CALTRANS DRB's

After graduating from the University of Colorado in 1964 with a degree in Architectural Engineering, went to work for the City of Las Angeles Bridge Division. In 1966 enlisted in the Navy Seabees and later received an appointment to Officer Candidate School in Newport, R.I. receiving a Navy Civil Engineer Corps commission. Served with MCB 11 in Vietnam and was also Officer in Charge of Seabee Team 1111. After leaving the Navy in 1970, went to work for the Ken R. White Company in Denver, now U.R.S., eventually becoming the Chief Bridge Engineer.

In 1974 became the Field Construction Manager for the construction of the nine building Auraria Higher Education Center. Went to work for Centric Corporation and later became vice president and worked on bridges, power plants, water and wastewater treatment plants, mining facilities, schools, hotels, and office and high rise buildings. In 1985 helped start Nucon Construction Corp. which later joined with J. A. Jones Construction Company to form Centric-Jones Constructors and was managing general partner. Headed up PCL Civil Constructors' U.S. operations until joining SEMA Construction in 2001 as its president. Retired from SEMA in 2006 and now do construction consulting, arbitration for the American Arbitration Association and have served on over 25 dispute review boards, including several as chairman. Member of the Board of Directors and training committee for the DRBF and is on the DRB candidate lists in Colorado, Washington and Michigan. Helped revise the CDOT Dispute and Claims Spec. and wrote the DRB Section of the new Spec and continues to serve on the CDOT ADR Task Force.

With a strong background in engineering and construction, have a firm foundation for management and administration. Have a broad knowledge of all construction areas with strong scheduling and cost capabilities. Have taken numerous classes in contract administration and contracts. Have overseen legal issues and claims. Have developed policy and procedure manuals.

In 1967 took the California P.E. exam and received a Professional Engineering registration from California in 1967. Currently licensed as a P.E. in Colorado and Tennessee. Also licensed as a Certified General Contractor in Florida. Received an MBA from C.U. in 1974. Served 23 years in the Naval Reserve Seabees and had three command tours, the last as the Commander of the Second Naval Construction Regiment, and retired as a Captain in 1992. After serving in several Rocky Mountain Chapter positions, served as national vice president of the Associated Builders and Contractors in 1994 and 1995.
