3	Sacramento Area Council of Governments/ <i>Yuba-Sutter Transit</i>	Yuba-Sutter Short Range Transit Plan (SRTP)	Yuba, Sutter	The project is an update of the FY 2002-2003 Yuba-Sutter SRTP. Stakeholders from the cities of Marysville and Yuba City as well as other unincorporated areas of the Yuba and Sutter counties will be included in the SRTP process. The new Yuba-Sutter SRTP will allow for continued and future transit planning processes and operations by Yuba-Sutter Transit.	\$70,825
3	El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC)	El Dorado County Short Range Transit Plan (SRTP)	El Dorado	The applicant will work in conjunction with El Dorado Transit, the Transit Advisory Committee, and the Social Services Transportation Advisory Council to review and update the SRTP for the western slope of El Dorado County. EDCTC will be the lead agency providing overall project management and a consultant will prepare the plan. Public meetings will be held to gather community input during the planning process.	\$70,000
3	Sacramento Area Council of Governments/ <i>Associated Students of the University of California, Davis Unitrans</i>	Unitrans Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Needs Analysis (Phase I) and Project Development (Phase II)	Yolo	A consultant team will be hired to assist in the completion of a two-phase ITS study. This project will provide technical assistance to assess needs and establish priorities for an ITS system to track bus arrival times (for improved dispatching and passenger information). The recent Unitrans Short Range Transit Plan identified on-time performance as the most critical need. Phase I will provide professional technical expertise to assist Unitrans in developing a Request for Proposals, establishing a procurement plan, and estimating costs, and assuring consistency with other regional ITS efforts. Phase II will provide technical assistance to implement an ITS system.	\$66,398
4	Metropolitan Transportation Commission/ <i>Marin County Transit District</i>	West Marin Transit Needs Assessment	Marin	The West Marin Transit Needs Assessment will evaluate the existing transit services (such as the Stagecoach route), identify needs and service gaps, and make recommendations to address these service gaps in rural Western Marin County.	\$100,000

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10	Tuolumne County Transportation Council/ <i>Columbia Junior College; Calaveras Council of Governments</i>	Inter-County Shelter Site Selection	Tuolumne	Columbia Junior College, Tuolumne and Calaveras Counties will coordinate efforts to select an appropriate site for a transfer shelter on the Columbia Campus, which is the only transit link between both counties. There are two possible locations on the campus. Appropriate site selection will meet the needs of transit customers, College administration and Tuolumne and Calaveras Counties. This project is to be spearheaded by a knowledgeable firm that can effectively work with the stakeholders to deliver a quality product in a timely manner.	\$39,000
10	Amador County Transportation Commission (ACTC)/ <i>Amador Regional Transit System (ARTS)</i>	Transit Development Plan Update and Transit Design Guidelines Manual	Amador	This grant will produce a time-critical update to the Transit Development Plan and an equally time-critical Transit Design Guidelines Manual. The planning process and future transportation system will benefit from an upfront agreement amongst ACTC, ARTS, local agencies, the community, and developers on transit design guidelines and other guiding principles. Application of these tools can be expected to avoid tens of millions of dollars in costs to 'retrofit' the existing built environment.	\$44,000
10	Alpine County Local Transportation Commission	Short Range Transportation Development Plan	Alpine	This Plan will (1) review existing transit services; (2) identify improvements to existing transit services including capital procurement program; (3) identify other alternative transit methods for meeting non-emergency transit needs such as a medical/social service Countywide Subsidized Volunteer Driver Program; (4) identify specific Native American transit needs; and (5) recommend development of transit programs that provide transit assistance to the greatest number of people with limited funding. Stakeholders include the Social Service Transportation Advisory Council, County Department of Public Works, County Department of Health and Human Services, and neighboring counties of Amador, Calaveras, El Dorado, and Douglas, Nevada.	\$44,265
