- Corridor includes LOSSAN rail line and Interstate 5






Shared Objectives

- Protect and enhance corridor's local, regional, and state assets



Approach

- SB468 established implementation blueprint







Highway, rail, transit, environmental protection and coastal access improvements



A 40-year comprehensive and sustainable solution for the region

- Express Lanes on I-5
- Double tracking the coastal rail line
- Integrated bike, pedestrian, and habitat improvements





- Adds 14 miles of carpool lanes
- Reconstructs highway and rail bridges
- One of 6 CMGC pilot projects
- Adds 3 miles of rail double track
- Restores San Elijo Lagoon
- Fills gaps in bike and pedestrian trails

Integrated Approach



- Stage 1 (\$270M) construction to begin in September
 - \$104M (STIP and TCIF)
 - \$166M (TNET, RSTP, CMAQ, FRA)
- Continue collaboration with CTC, local cities, Coastal Commission, and CMGC contractor
- Phase 1 Rail and Highway open to traffic by 2021
